





Growing Larger Gourds

Try to get the best seeds to start with. Genetics makes a world of difference.

Harry Hurley and a Kentucky gourd grower have grown very large bushels and they were very thick. IGS and others sell some very good bushel seeds as Bushel 100 + .

To make your gourds larger, you will need more growing days. Start by planting the seeds indoors.

When ready to transplant, you can plant where you have mixed manure with soil.

Cut the bottom off a 5 gallon bucket and set over your plant if

it is too cold or chance of frost.

Spread black covering around plant if it is too cold and this will draw heat to help your plant to grow.

I used to dig a hole about 10 inches from the root and pour rain water mixed with miracle grow in the hole.

I grew a 325 pound pumpkin doing this.

After nice weather comes, you can remove the bucket and black covering


We had quite a bit of activity at our Membership booth in South Bend this year. We would like to welcome all of those who renewed their membership and especially those who signed up for new memberships.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Read general terms and conditions and agriculture/horticulture department terms and conditions. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with and understand all terms and conditions concerning exhibition.

- 1. Gourds must predominate in all entries.
- 2. All embellishments must be natural, unless otherwise stated.
- 3. Entry tags must be attached to entries.
- 4. Only one entry may be made in a class by one individual.
- 5. No finish on fresh or dried gourds classes 1-19.
- 6. The Indiana State Fair will provide containers where needed.
- 7. The Assistant in charge of this division reserves the right to discard any exhibit whenever it does not make a good appearance.
- 8. Stems should remain on fresh and dried gourds classes 1-19. Stems are optional on crafted gourds.
- 9. Ornamental gourds: usually colorful with yellow blossoms. Hard-shell gourds: varying shades of green with white blossoms.

Class Description

FRESH GOURDS - Premiums - \$6-5-4-3-2

- 1 3 identical size, color, marking, and finger shape Crown of Thorns
- 2 5 identical size, color, and marking spoons
- 3 5 different size, color, and marking spoons
- 4 10 assorted varieties of ornamentals, no warties
- 5 10 assorted size, shape, color warties
- 6 5 different varieties small, mature hard-shells
- 7 1 mature hard-shell of any variety
- 8 25 assorted ornamentals and/or hard-shells, may be arranged for a farm market display

DRIED GOURDS - Premiums - \$6-5-4-3-2

- 9 Assortment of natural finish ornamentals and/or small hard-shells in an undecorated, natural finish gourd bowl (bowl=50%, contents=50%)
- 10 3 different varieties bottle type gourds (such as bilobal birdhouse, Chinese, Indonesian, Mexican, or lump-in-neck bottle) 9 inches or more in height.
- 11 3 same variety bottle gourds (such as Sennari, Miniature Chinese bottle or miniature Nigerian bottle) under 5 inches in height.
- 12 3 different varieties basket type gourds (such as bushel, kettle, Martin house, basketball, Corsican flat, canteen) 20 inches or more in circumference.
- 13 3 basket type gourds (such as cannonball, apple, canteen, tobacco box/sugar bowl) of the same variety, shape and size and under 20 inches in circumference.
- 14 3 dipper, siphon or trough type gourds (such as dipper, snake, club, banana, penguin, maranka, or zucca) all the same variety, shape and size **OR** all 3 different varieties.
- 15 Longest straight long handled dipper or snake or baton gourd.
- 16 Largest gourd in circumference.
- 17 3 cleaned, ready for use luffa cylindrical (long) **OR** luffa operculata (ball).
- 18 One naturally grown unusually shaped gourd
- 19 One molded, tied or hand-contrived unusually shaped gourd
