

President's Message

Hello everyone

This will be the last Tendril before our State Show which is the first weekend of May, 2015. The next Tendril after this will have award details and pictures from the State Show. We still have room for vendors at our State Show so please get your application in to Pat Moore or Tom Benedict as soon as possible so they can get the layout worked up. We are also looking for volunteers. We are always appreciative of anyone who would like to be a helper at the show, especially with set up and tear down. Last year we had a very good response and I would like to personally thank all of you for your consideration. Please contact our Show Chairperson Pat Moore to schedule a time when you can help.

Now is also the time to start thinking about spring planting. I have had my best luck with starting seeds inside in small pots or Styrofoam cups about two weeks before I want to set them out. In northern Indiana I try to get my plants set out by mid May. Check for your local average last frost date to see when would be best for your area. Once you set your gourd plants out, give them some protection from the sun and wind until they look like they are doing well. I use gallon milk jugs with the bottom cut off to make little green houses for each of the plants. Leave the cap off and push a stick thru from the top down into the ground to hold the jug in place. If you wait until about mid May you can plant your seeds direct into the garden. I would rec-

ommend that you soak your seeds overnight before planting them and make sure you keep the soil moist until the seed is sprouted and pops up thru the soil. The milk jug greenhouses also work well to help seeds germinate when you plant seeds direct into the ground. It keeps the ground from drying out before the seed can sprout. You can water through the top of the jug as needed. Remove the jugs after the plants have a few true leaves. Fertilize your gourd plants every couple weeks and water as needed but don't overwater. Gourds that set on after the end of July usually don't have enough time to mature unless they are the smaller gourds or ornamentals. The Giant gourds are very hard to grow to maturity in northern states so if you have your heart set on growing them, start your plants inside by mid April, set them out in a protected area as soon as possible, and be prepared for a frost.

During Feb. meeting we then topped our bowl off with coiling of our choice. Some of us brought some gourd work we've been working on & shared with the group. Next month we are going to try to create a tea kettle using multiple gourds, should be a fun project & always interesting to see how we each create differently. Some members are keeping busy this winter by working on their pieces for the state show in May. Yeah think spring!

Sugar Creek Gourd Patch & Thorn Tree Gourd Patch (Karen Niemeyer)

Both the Sugar Creek and Thorn Tree gourd patches meet at the Thorntown Public Library in Boone County. Visitors are invited to any of the meetings: 6-8:00 p.m. first and third Wednesdays, and 2-4:00 p.m. on the second and fourth Wednesdays. At the February 18 and 25 meetings Annette Knox will teach how to paint (with acrylics) small gourds to look like Indiana quail. Members have completed a variety of decoupage gourd projects and are now making plans for individual exhibits for the IGS state gourd show in May and the Indiana State Fair in August. Visitors are invited to both the library and to patch meetings, and questions may be directed to Karen Niemeyer at 765-436-7348. On March 28 patch members will operate an IGS booth at the Monroe County Master Gardeners' Fair in Bloomington. In May a class "Rosemaling on Gourds" is planned; Jan Boettcher will teach this Norwegian folk art. Patch members will demonstrate techniques and display gourds at Karen's Thorntown home on June 27-28 when her yard is on Lebanon's Shalom House Garden Tour, a fund-raiser for the shelter. Karen plans to feature growing and dried gourds in her flower beds as usual but will add a painted tree on the side of her garden shed with a variety of gourd bird houses displayed among the branches.

In March we will look at different ways to treat and start seeds, including ways to warm the soil.

Coffee and cookies were served, and everyone seem happy and excited to attend the next meeting on March 15, 2015. The time of the meeting is at 2pm, and the location is at the Goodrich Park in Winchester, Indiana at the cabin. Becky Whitted will do another demonstration and Lois Wright plans to have some gourd seeds started to show how to start seeds.

Message from the Show Chair

Hello to All,

I am honored to again be the Show Chair for the Indiana Gourd Society's State Show in 2015. Our show will again be at the Boone County 4-H Fairgrounds in Lebanon, Indiana, for the third year. Our 2015 State Show Book is online for all to see and use.

I would like to highlight a few thing about this year's show:

- This year will be the 3rd annual vendor's competition for the Joyce Dankowski Memorial Award "Best Vendor Display". We would like to congratulate **Delaina DeHaven, "Gourd Haven",** the 2014 winner, for her lovely display last year.
- IGS has added a new division in the adult competition categories. Division 1 is now the "Memorial Division", honoring our deceased members that helped our society by educating the public with their unique talents. In Division 1 you may enter only one (1) entry per person per class. In all other divisions, two (2) entries are permitted.
- The Jim Story Manipulated Gourd Classes are now in Division 1. After judging the corkscrew, knotted and grown in a mold classes; all of these entries will be judged together for competition at AGS level.
- This year two (2) new classes have been added: Class 22- "My Way" -any botanical design not already listed and Class 59- Gourd Pull a gourd attached to a pull for a light/fan/etc.
- Warning: Please pay close attention to the competition classes that state, Required: a 3"X5" card with..... this card is <u>required</u> in all of Division 2, and some in Divisions 6, 7, 8 and 10. Your entry could be marked down by the judges, if the <u>required card</u> is not with your entry. These cards are also for public education purposes.
- **Awards:** The awards given out at the show will be announced and awarded at the Saturday night dinner this year. Some awards will be placed on the competition gourds on Friday night after judging is over, but will be officially announced at the dinner. Other awards, certificates and cash prices will be awarded at the dinner. So come to the dinner and see these awards presented to the winners. These awards will also be re-announced on Sunday afternoon.
- **Members Sales Booth 2015:** Again this year IGS will have as a members perk, a members selling booth for your gourd art, 10 or less items. Your **FEE** for this is to volunteer 4 hours at the show where IGS needs you. See the show book for info and registration form, dead line is postmarked-April 30, 2015.
