#### **PATCH NEWS**

#### **Central Indiana Patch (Diane Werblo, contact)**

In late November after eating yummy leftovers from the Autumn Art Fair where Jean Long was a TERRIFIC help in the kitchen, we *finally* passed out the award money from the Indiana State Fair. RoJene Gillentine, Danny Hall, Jean Long, Mac McCrary, Ann Stankiewicz, Sandra and Tim Tim Townsend and I made holiday ornaments out of small gourds. I finally talked to one of the Garfield Park Arts Center clay teachers about our gourd/pottery project. Apparently we need to find someone with an outdoor kiln or we need to do it raku style. We'll let you know how it turns out. CIP members RoJene, Jean, Mac, and I helped out at Garfield Park's Christmas celebration and signed up three interested people. We are not meeting in December. In January and February we will be painting gourds in the style of some modern artists.

#### Sugar Creek Gourd Patch & Thorn Tree Gourd Patch (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

The Thorn Tree and Sugar Creek Gourd Patches are issuing a Jim Story Pussy Willow Artistic Design challenge. Pictured (see page one) are three 2" x 18" pieces of one limb of a willow tree. In September, 2003 Jim Story had placed several pussy willow starts with the Ways and Means Committee of the Indiana Gourd Society. Karen Niemeyer acquired two and the trees are large and doing well at the Thorntown home she moved into in November 2002. One small limb died, however, and it has been cut into these three portions. The fungus on each is hard and dry and quite interesting. Since Jim provided the pussy willow starts and is famous for his artistic designs with gourds, the two Thorntown patches will provide these to the first three gourders who agree to incorporate one into a design with gourds and exhibit it at the IGS state show in May. After the show the artist may reclaim the entry and a \$25.00 cash prize. Note that this is a challenge, not a competition, and each entrant will receive the prize. Both patches have returned to their typical scheduled sessions at the Thorntown Public Library, 124 N. Market St., Thorntown. The Thorn Tree patch meets from 2-4:00 on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays, and the Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets from 6-8:00 p.m. on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays. In January and February crayons and melters will be available for wax crayon gourd crafting. A few gourds will be available as well as other supplies and equipment. It is helpful if new participants call Karen to let her know of plans to attend, as this will assure proper supplies are on hand.

Carol Brown has for a few years attended these patch meetings but is establishing a Hendricks County patch in Danville, Indiana. Gourders may participate in multiple patches and some of our members have been enjoying sessions with the Central Indiana Gourd Patch organized by Diane Werblo and Mac McCrary.

The Thorn Tree Gourd Patch has completed a portion of Indiana's traveling gourd and will be turning it over to the Linda's Gourd Patch so that its section may be completed and displayed at the May state show. Jan Boettcher had painted the Sugar Creek portion in 2011, and the SCGP has issued a challenge to the Thorn Tree, Central Indiana, and West Central Indiana patches to add their unique designs to the gourd. A history of the decorative bits is being written but someone needs to let Karen know: how did Michigan end up on the gourd in 2004?

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING SEED PRODUCTION

Across the country there are very few gourd seed producers available anymore. Indiana Gourd Society is one of the few left. At this time I am doing most of the work to keep the Pure Seed Project going. I cannot continue doing the majority of the work involved by myself. If I cannot find at least two other individuals who want to get involved and learn to do this and are willing to work with me on a regular basis then I am afraid we will have to discontinue this service as a Society.

What is involved:

- Growing individual type gourds in isolation or hand pollinating each type
- Removing and curing the seeds
- Testing seeds on a regular basis (1 X year)
- Packaging seeds for resale
- Selling seeds from home and other sources
- Tracking sales of seeds

If anyone would like to be involved with the process, please contact me as soon as possible.
