Plans seem to be progressing well. We have decided to have some "Make It Take It" activities at the show for the benefit of those who might want to learn to make a quick craft out of gourds. This will be open to adults and children, but all children under 10 must have an adult with them. We will have "Make It Take It" kits available for a minimal cost. There will be free activities going on for all children, such as spinner or shard necklaces, which they can decorate at no cost.

This year we will also be offering 2-3 hour long workshops. We are trying to keep the cost under \$35.00, of which \$5.00 will be for our Society. We still have a few openings for instructors.
