Sugar Creek and Thorn Tree Gourd Patches (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

Both patches meet at the Thorntown Public Library, 124 N. Market St., Thorntown. In February, both groups worked on 4" quilt squares and on crazy quilt gourds. They also completed a snowflake/deer scene begun on January 16. What better source of inspiration than the Christmas box lid from Donaldson's Finer Chocolates of Lebanon!

On March 6 from 6-8 p.m. EST the Sugar Creek Gourd Patch will prepare gourd bowls for both patches and on March 20 from 2-4 p.m. Monta Taylor will teach pine needle weaving on the rims of the bowls. On April 3 the Sugar Creek Patch will meet from 6-8 p.m. EST and on April 17 from 2-4 p.m. EST the Thorn Tree Patch will meet, both working to complete unfinished projects, to assemble a gourd block quilt, and to prepare a black and white gallery for display at the May IGS state show.

There will be no May 1 meeting as members prepare to assist with setup and operation of the show. On May 15 from 2-4 p.m. EST crafters will display and discuss the state show and their entries and make plans for June - August sessions. Visitors are always welcome. Call Karen at the library (765-436-7348) to learn what supplies and/or equipment should be assembled for sessions.

In February, our core members finished the quilt squares for our group gallery entry into the IGS State Show. We then worked on snowman kits from Sandra Townsend. In March we are doing Easter decorations -- eggs, bunnies, chicks. In April, each person is to bring a white-painted gourd and black Sharpies - fat and fine lines - for a "Black and White" Zentangle/Zendoodle or calligraphy project for the State Show. Hello everyone. This is just to keep everyone updated on the progress of the 2019 Indiana Gourd Society State show, the first Friday and Saturday of May 2019, at the Fulton County Museum, by Rochester, Indiana. Plans seem to be progressing well.

We are always in need of and thankful for all the volunteers we can get, so please consider giving some of your free time helping at the show. We really appreciate it, and it allows everyone to take part in classes or just enjoy the show.

This year we will be offering shorter (2-3 hour) workshops at less cost (\$35.00 and under-\$5.00 of this goes to IGS) for those that want to basically learn a technique. Workshops for our May show are being posted in this Tendril issue. Our colored workshop flyer will be online and mailed out by mid March.

For those who can't take a class, we will be offering some "Make It Take It" activities for anyone who might want to make a quick craft out of gourds. We will have "Make It Take It" kits available for a minimal fee. You can either put them together at the show with some assistance, or take them home to do later. This will be open to adults and children, but all children under 10 must have an adult with them. There will be ongoing free activities for all children, such as spinners, or shard necklaces, which they can decorate at no cost. We will be having many demos again this year. Everyone did a great job last year and it was a lot of fun. If there is a specific demo you would like to see, please let us know and we can try to fit it in.
