BACK TO BASICS

EVER WONDER WHAT JUDGES BASE THEIR AWARDS ON?

The Kokomo show is a great way to find out! Judges are assigned categories to judge at the IGS show. Each pair of judges will need an assistant-clerk. You will learn by watching the judges to see what they are looking for in a Blue-Ribbon winner. You are only needed for 2 hours, from 8am to approximately 10am, on Saturday morning of the show.

This is a great experience for anyone who plans on entering any dried gourds, crafts or art in ANY show. It may give you that "insight" that could help you to know what judges look for.

As a clerk, you will record the judges' score, make sure they have everything they need, and adjust identification tags to reveal the names of the entrants, after they have been judged. Several new members served as clerks at the '06 show and they said it was enjoyable and very educational.
