NEW: AGS Manipulated Gourd Crafting Contest by Terry Noxel

For 10 years the American Gourd Society has been encouraging growers to manipulate and mold their gourds and enter them in competitions at the local gourd shows and the national AGS Jim Story Award contest. Over the years several chapters have added categories in their competitions to include manipulated gourd art. Now we'd like to make it part of the AGS magazine with a quarterly contest along the lines of the quarterly crafted gourd contest.

What will be the parameters of the Manipulated Gourd Crafting Contest? First, the artist does not have to be grower of the manipulated or molded gourd. One or more gourds may be incorporated in the art work, as long as a minimum of one is a manipulated gourd. You can incorporate single or multiple crafting techniques and embellishments of your choice in the piece, but gourds must predominate. All work must be the original work of the person submitting the entry; partnership or group entries are not allowed. Each person is limited to ONE entry per issue.

Judging. While the judges will consider the overall artistry of the piece, they will also be focused on how the manipulated gourd is incorporated and compliments the work. For all contests, originality, creativity, as well as appropriateness to the category, skill and overall craftsmanship will be considered when judging each entry. Other considerations are technical difficulty, effective use of materials and overall construction. The judges will be three (3) highly respected professional gourd artists, AGS certified judges and/or multiple award winners.

Photography. It is important to remember that while it is the GOURD that will be judged, and NOT the photography, it is very important to submit a large, high resolution, quality photograph with good detail, lighting and an uncluttered background. Photographs of poor quality are not suitable for magazine reproduction.

Why Enter? The first-place winner of each quarterly contest will receive a free 1-year membership extension of their AGS membership, and all winners will also receive a digital copy of the magazine for sharing with family and friends. In addition, the first-place artist will be profiled in a feature article the following issue. *Note: First place winners may only win one membership prize during a 12-month period.

How to Enter: It is easy to enter and there is no fee, so we hope that YOU will consider entering for the next contest. You can send in your entry as soon as you are ready. Do it while you are thinking about it!

<u>Artist's info:</u> Please send a one paragraph bio that includes your home state, and brief information about you and/or your gourd entry.

<u>Photo info:</u> Submit TWO photos of the entry, from different angles and ONE of the uncrafted, manipulated gourd before its transformation into art. JPG format is preferred and the largest file size possible.

<u>Email info</u>: Send artist info and photos to <u>noxel.terry@gmail.com</u> Photos must be submitted as ATTACHMENTS, not embed into your email, pdf or word document. Please note "Gourd Contest Entry" in the subject line.

Entries by USPS mail: Send artist info and photos to Terry Noxel, 100 Barton Rd, Windsor, NY 13865-2501. Photos will not be returned unless a self-addressed/stamped envelope is included.

Manipulated Gourd Contest Themes and Deadlines

These are pretty broad categories and any manipulated or molded gourd can be used to create your entry. Manipulated gourd floral containers include vases and planters for dried, live or artificial flowers or plants. Manipulated gourd animals can be a real or fantasy animal, it can be 3D or have animal designs on it. Non-floral containers can be baskets, bowls, boxes (lids optional) and Manipulated gourd sculptures can be any assemblage using a manipulated gourd(s).

Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. Combined Meeting Minutes Membership and Board of Directors' Meeting October 19, 2019

President Loretta Pressel called the IGS membership meeting to order at 10:10 a.m. in the Thorntown Public Library. There were 13 present: Loretta, Ron Pressel, Dale Winger, Phil Moorhead, Karen Niemeyer, Pat Moore, Sandra Townsend, RoJene Gillentine, Diane Werblo, Mac McCrary, Ida Kennedy, Richard Ryan and Fran Bascom.

The minutes of the October 20, 2018, membership meeting were approved after a motion by Phil and a second by Diane.

The treasurer's report was presented by Phil. As of September 30, 2019, total monies available equal \$20,496.58. This balances with the bank, and all federal forms have been filed. The majority of the decrease is attributed to no longer selling seeds, down-sizing Ways and Means, and not charging for vendor booths at state show. The 2019 show did lose money. Karen moved the treasurer's report be accepted and filed for audit; Diane seconded; motion carried. It was noted that the 2019-2020 budget of \$23,600 was previously approved by the board, was published in the Tendril, and does not need to be approved by members.

The membership meeting was suspended at 10:20 a.m. and the board of directors called to order.

Phil moved and Pat seconded that Helen Thomas be selected as first vice-president and RoJene Gillentine become second vice-president; all five directors voted "yes": Ron, Sandra, Pat, Phil, and Diane.

At 10:40 a.m. the board meeting was suspended and the membership meeting reconvened.

Karen moved and Diane seconded that Shirley Gates be elected to the position of Director 3 to fill in for Ron Pressel, whose term will expire Dec. 31, 2019. Motion carried.

It was agreed that the directors would meet after the membership meeting to identify a president for 2020.

Pat presented the membership report: She sent out 65 renewal notices. Total membership is 185. She has membership reports for patch leaders and asks that leaders contact former area members who have not yet renewed their IGS membership. She noted that those who participate in patches are not required to be IGS members. Lesa Briones will be the new leader in Patch 10, also known as Linda's Gourd Patch.

Loretta reported that Ways and Means still has hats, visors, aprons, Jim Story DVD's, and the books "Vine to Design" and "Making Gourd Musical Instruments" available for sale. Good turnout at the state show resulted in more than \$700 in sales. A new committee chair is needed as Loretta is retiring as chair.

Sandra provided fliers for distribution and promotion of the 2020 state show. She reported that 2019 was successful with attendance about the same as the previous year. The 2020 theme will be "Down on the Farm".

Diane reported that during the 2020 Indiana State Fair the horticulture building will begin absorbing 4-H displays, resulting in services and space having to be adjusted. She feels that only three handouts are needed: list of online educational articles, membership/patch areas, and bird house information. We need to assure that our contractual agreement is honored by the Indiana State Fair. She had a good number of helpers and volunteers but needs to add a sign-in sheet for members, saying, "We want to know you came..." It was noted that legally a sign-in sheet is not as good as collecting individual slips or cards, thus assuring privacy for information. Rick Ryan is working to promote gourds through people he met while working the state fair booth. He plans to promote gourds in southern Indiana counties especially.

Phil reported that he has received archives materials and the hard drive from Dallas Lunsford and is reviewing. Under old business Pat asked whether or not we want to change the membership year to January through December instead of basing it on the month members originally signed up. Karen moved and Pat seconded that the membership year be July 1-June 30. Pat and Phil will work out details as to how to put this into effect. Motion carried.

Also under old business obituaries were discussed. It was decided to put a small notice in the <u>Tendril</u> and to create a permanent list on the IGS web site. The family of Jim Ballard has requested the loan of the clown head bushel basket gourd for display at a memorial service for Jim. Karen had retrieved it from the IGS storage facility, and Phil will see that it is delivered. The Moorheads ordered flowers from IGS for Jane Story's funeral, and IGS had agreed to pay for that tribute. It was suggested that IGS create a sympathy card that expresses thanks for membership; Mac and Diane will design and get board approval.

There was an 11:58-12:08 lunch break. When the membership meeting resumed Phil noted that two articles from archived educational pieces had been printed in the <u>Tendril</u>. Diane will resume editing archives articles and assist Phil with updating them.

Fran displayed the magazine <u>The Lakes</u> and noted that it is both mailed and may be picked up at businesses. A quarter-page ad costs \$340 for a month and reaches 40,000 people. There was spirited discussion on IGS state show publicity, and the issue was turned over to the show committee. This included the show committee's making the decision about advertising in <u>The Lakes</u>.

Under new business for the membership meeting the IGS board recommended that an Advisory Council be formed and sit with the board. The council would also vote with the board. Per the June 22, 2019, board meeting, it was noted that the board does not need members' permission to form an Advisory Council nor to determine

who may serve on it nor how they may be removed from the Council. After discussion Phil moved and Ida seconded that IGS leadership be 6 officers (serving as initial Advisory Council appointees) and 5 directors, all of whom may be patch leaders or designees but who must be IGS members; motion carried. Previously, only the 5 directors could vote; this motion allows the 6 officers to also vote and, in effect, serve as an Advisory Council. However, the board may identify others to also serve on the Council. It should be noted that since Phil and Pat are directors, as well as officers, they will have only one vote, not two votes each.

Pat, as membership chair, can contact members to say, "A patch is being formed and are you interested?" but she cannot provide contact information to members.

The membership meeting was suspended at 1:04 p.m. The board of directors were reconvened. By consensus the directors agreed that Phil should continue to serve as Treasurer and Pat as Membership Secretary.

At 1:05 p.m. the directors' meeting was suspended and the membership meeting reconvened.

IGS awards were discussed. Karen moved and Ida seconded that IGS suspend immediately the Puckett and Roll of Honor Awards; the motion carried although there was one negative vote.

The IGS board will meet on January 25 with a snow date of February 1 to vote on officers. The meeting will be held at Thorntown Public Library at 10:00 a.m. EST.

There being no further business Fran moved and Phil seconded that the 2019 membership meeting be adjourned. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 1:30 p.m. The board of directors' meeting was reconvened, and, with no further business, this meeting was adjourned also.
