An Answer to Karen's Mouse Chewing Article in the last Tendril

Sorry you lost so many gourds to mice chewing on them. I've never thought about not using mouse chewed gourd. I usually cut them into shards or bowls or something or just worked around the mouse hole. I never thought about gourds transmitting diseases from mice. In the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) (2017, July 5) article *Rodents: Directly transmitted by rodents* (https://www.cdc.gov/rodents/diseases/direct.html) the CDC notes that rats and possibly mice transmit bacteria diseases. The disease occurs worldwide; Streptobacillus moniliformis in North America and Europe; Spirillum moniliformis in Asia and Africa. The disease spreads by bite or scratch wound from an infected rodent, or contact with a dead rodent, or eating or drinking food or water that is contaminated by rat feces. So, I guess it is possible as they usually eat the seeds and poop in the gourds too.

An answer to the question: <u>Why mice like chewing on some type gourds over others?</u> **If I were a mouse:** I would say it's due to the actual hardness of the hard-outer shell, not the thickness of the total shell. Especially if I have several different types of gourds to chew on, I would start with the softest hard-outer shells first and chew my way to the hardest ones over the winter.

I have not grown or worked with banana gourds, so I cannot say how hard their shells are. But as a mouse, why waste my time on a gourd that skinny when there are bigger, softer gourds to chew on.

The few canteens I have worked with did not impress me much one way or another as to the shell's hardness. So, as a mouse, they must be harder than you would think, or I just did not get to them yet.

Apple Gourds on the other hand, have VERY HARD outer shells and the seeds are usually in an awfully hard glob/ball. I have made a few Apple Gourd Wren Birdhouses that I hand chipped carved, gouged or power carved on only because of the shells hardness, not to mention how long it took to bust up the small bowling ball inside. As a mouse, I would probably break a tooth.

So, here is something you might try next time. I have stored a lot of different type birdhouse gourds in my barn in open wire cages. I use an awl to put a very small started hole in the shell of each gourd where I want the bird's entry hole to be (this starter hole is easy to patch if not needed later). If the mice find these gourds, they usually chew the hole where I started it. The mice would be chewing a hole anyway, I just gave them a place to start, where I wanted a hole. This did not always work but did more times than not.

Hope I have helped answer your questions and made you smile.

INDIANA GOURD SOCIETY SHOW COMMITTEE MEETING OCTOBER 17, 2020

The show committee for the Indiana Gourd Society met at 12:50 p.m. at the Thorntown Public Library. Present were Sandra Townsend, Phil Moorhead, Pat Moore, Karen Niemeyer, Peggy Robertson, RoJene Gillentine, Rosemary Hill, Shirley Gates and Connie Dickinson.

The state show will be May 7-8, 2021, at the Fulton County Historical in Rochester. It may be that an outside show should be considered and even no competition due to what the unknown COVID-19 Virus situation will be in May 2021.

It was agreed to keep the AGS Jim Story classes, even if IGS has no competition. For 2021 IGS will not follow Jane Story's request with her \$2500 estate gift because the current IGS and AGS rules conflict with her requirements. We shall make AGS changes as needed for 2021 but may take time later to adjust to Jane's stipulations. Thus, IGS will pay for the Jim Story awards in 2021, not Jane. In 2022 IGS may judge for ribbons, judge the Jim Story Award for AGS, then judge per Jane's rules for \$\$ awards.

At this time we need to change the 3 classes on page 9 of the show book to be what AGS wants. Jane will no longer pay for the floral design awards (p. 9). We could eliminate it from page 9 and use only the competition classes on page 12. However, Pat and Phil will work on AGS's wording to make appropriate changes in IGS rules.

We can put the show book for the 2021 show up on the web as soon as possible, and the print copy could be mailed at a later date. We shall list changes and send a flier to folks instead of printing for \$800.00 and mailing for \$400.00.

INDIANA GOURD SOCIETY MEETINGS October 17, 2020 IGS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

President Pat Moore called the meeting to order at 10:15 a.m. A quorum of six was present: Pat, Phil Moorhead, RoJene Gillentine, Shirley Gates, Karen Niemeyer, and Sandra Townsend, as well as patch representatives Rosemary Hill, Peggy Robertson, and Connie Dickinson.

Phil presented the 2020 budget and sub-accounts, noting that although IGS budgeted \$23,600, there was a loss of \$5114.25. Available funds total \$17,597, so the proposed 2021 budget is \$17,597.00. Although we cannot budget above available funds, there can be up to 10% of unassigned funds (a total of \$797.00) to allow some flexibility. We can project income, but we cannot budget against it. Karen moved the 2021 budget be approved as proposed; Shirley seconded; motion carried.

Since IGS is losing \$2000-5000 per year, there was discussion on where there could be cuts; one possibility is <u>Tendril</u> printing of \$700 and this will require a membership vote.

Phil reported that our corporation insurance through Scottsdale is being dropped because the underwriter is not writing for non-profits. Phil contacted three other companies and two refused to quote. One sent a questionnaire for follow-up with questions such as, do we sponsor a parade, and do we require vendors and groups to provide proof of liability insurance. It may be necessary to provide board background checks. New IGS insurance SHOULD cover patch events, even though the venues of patch meetings will have coverage. If there are children's events, only people with current background checks may serve as workers. Pat will check with the American Legion regarding their insurance provider.

INDIANA GOURD SOCIETY MEETINGS October 17, 2020 IGS MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The October 17, 2020, membership meeting of the Indiana Gourd Society was called to order at the Thorntown Public Library at 10:40 a.m. by president Pat Moore. Nine members were present: Pat, Phil Moorhead, RoJene Gillentine, Karen Niemeyer, Sandra Townsend, Peggy Robertson, Rosemary Hill, Connie Dickinson, and Shirley Gates.

Phil explained that IGS is set up so that the membership votes for the board of directors and then the board votes for the officers, who do not have to be board members but have to be members. Because it was felt that transparency was inadequate, IGS had voted to have one member from each patch sit in and vote with the board, but these are not identified to the state; this lets the patches better know what IGS discusses and they can better disseminate information. There are 11 positions, but Phil and Pat hold more than one but may only vote once, thus there are 9 votes and 5 will carry an action.

The minutes of the October 19, 2019, membership meeting were reviewed and approved by consensus. The notes from the January 25, 2020, board discussion were distributed.

Karen asked all members to sign an apple gourd onto which she had burned a Sudoku puzzle; this will be sent to Bill Freihofer, former board member.

Phil presented the treasurer's report: \$10,798.97 in savings, \$8611.89 in checking, a total of \$16,910.86 in spendable funds. In addition, there is \$2500.00 in escrow for Story Awards. The business entity and all other reports have been completed. Karen moved the report be filed for audit; Shirley seconded; motion carried.

Pat provided the membership report: 174 total memberships in 2020, with 126 households. This is down from 2017 (210), 2018 (192), and 2019 (185). There have only been five new members. Pat reviews every six months and deletes from current membership those who have not renewed, but she retains the information in archives. Appreciation was expressed for her efforts.

There was no 2020 state show and thus no report. Phil has refunded all exhibitor payments. However, there were costs for show book printing and mailing as well as for workshop printing.

Athough IGS has received \$2500.00 from Jane Story's estate to maintain the Jim Story Awards, there are stipulations we do not meet at this time so her funds will be held for a time.

There was no Indiana State Fair, so our award of \$50.00 was not given.

Archives chair Phil Moorhead continues to receive historic materials and preserves them digitally. Paper copies will be placed in the storage facility.

Ways and Means: Phil mails books or DVD's monthly.

There were no other committee reports.

Under old business a draft of an IGS sympathy card, as prepared by Diane Werblo was reviewed and thanks expressed to Diane for her quality work. Shirley moved that we accept the artwork as prepared by Diane, that we use invitation-size and envelopes, and that the poem be slightly enlarged and centered; Karen seconded; motion carried. Karen moved that the membership chair print and mail the cards in a timely fashion; Phil seconded; motion carried.

An obituary column was discussed. Phil moved and Karen seconded that a memorials column be put on the web with picture, name and date, and that similar information be included in the IGS scrapbook; motion carried. Phil moved and RoJene seconded that, when information is available, an announcement box be included in <u>The Tendril</u>...no picture, just announcement of the passing; motion carried. It was further recommended that if someone knows of a death, that person should notify an IGS officer.

Phil asked whether or not we want to remove the membership requirement to access the IGS web site; consensus was to keep the member i.d. and password for now.

Although the judging class was postponed in 2020, Phil would like to offer it in March or April 2021, just before the May state show. He noted that in Indiana judges and clerks get paid.

After a short break the meeting resumed. Karen moved and Phil seconded that directors be re-elected to serve until Dec. 31, 2022; motion carried. Those elected were:
