# **PATCH NEWS**

### Sugar Creek Gourd Patches (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

**LIVING THE GOURD LIFE** - The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets on the first and third Wednesdays, from 2-4 pm ET, in the Thorntown Public Library meeting room. Visitors are welcome and a call to Karen Niemeyer in advance will assure that supplies are on hand (765-436-7348). Boone County fair open show entries were discussed at the August session, with all entries receiving a blue ribbon except for a Christmas ornament that took champion. The patch is celebrating their 17 entries in the Indiana State Fair, where Jim Bennett took Best of Show -- congratulations are expressed to Jim plus he received the \$50 prize that the IGS gives to the Best of Show entrant. The group took eight first-place blue ribbons, two second-place, four third-place, and had three exhibits that did not place. There is a question about the judge's comment that one entry (in the fair theme category) was not in Pacer colors, but we found no mention in the Ag-Hort rules that colors were preferred; did we miss something?

The Patch plans to meet on Sept. 6 and 20 and Oct. 4 and 18. As always, participants may work on their own projects. We shall also have gourds and supplies available for decoupage projects. There will be 4" gourd squares on hand for painting fall leaves and snow flakes to be added to the library's gourd block quilt. Job's Tears seeds and needles will allow us to begin working on necklaces in the Bill Freihofer style.

### Linda's Gourd Patch (Peggy Robertson, contact)

Linda's Patch will meet in September and October the 3rd Sunday of the month, from 1-3 pm ET at 1224W 600 N, Greenfield, IN. In July we worked on wind chimes and some of us simply finished projects from our June meeting (see photos, page 3). We had 11 attendees at the meeting including a couple of potential new members. In August we made angels from a banana gourd, in September we are going to start on a musical instrument, and in October we are planning on teaching newer members how to green clean a gourd. Somewhere in there we are going to the home of Carl Abner to see his trellis of manipulated gourds, and tips on how to manipulate them.
