Sugar Creek Gourd Patches (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets in the Thorntown Public Library meeting room from 2-4 pm on the first and third Wednesdays. All sessions encourage working on individual projects but on March 6 and 20 participants want to learn/work on pyrography (woodburning). On April 3 and 17 they will begin writing their favorite sayings/messages on large gourds using pyrography, paint, and markers. On May 1 and 15 will be a first-ever non-gourd activity--making place mats using old greeting cards. On June 5 and 19 melted crayon art on gourds will be the feature. Then on July 3 and 17 we'll do Zentangle. Some supplies are furnished, but it is helpful if Karen Niemeyer knows how many want to participate; just call Karen at the library: 765-436-7348.

Central Indiana Patch (Diane Werblo, contact)

CIP meets on second Tuesdays from 1-3 pm upstairs at the Garfield Park Arts Center in the SW corner. Best laid plans of mice and men often do go astray: in January instead of working on Valentine gourds, Jean Long, Mac McCrary, and Diane Werblo pawed through a huge box of costume jewelry a friend gave us after looking at the AGS FB page. He said, "I thought you could decorate gourds with these." We all found something! We discussed tools to use to puncture gourd shells. Mac mentioned push pins, but the little ones aren't sturdy enough. Jean said she had a series of small awls to make holes; Diane teased her about being, "holier than thou." We realized the fat bangle bracelets could make good gourd stands. Jean sanded filler on a large round gourd. Diane only sorted jewelry, pulling out pieces with red stones. As always, Mac kept us entertained with bad jokes. The other "usual suspects" had doctor, dentist, and family obligations. We hope to see them again soon.

In February, since we met on Fat Tuesday, we first put on Mardi Gras beads and shared King Cake. Then Mary Johnson, Jean Long, RoJene Gillentine, Mac McCrary, new member Laura Taube, and Diane Werblo shared seeds, germination info, and growing tips. Some pawed through the jewelry box, Laura painted a gourd, and RoJene showed us a silver and white ornament she's working on. This spring we will be working on making delicate flowers and butterflies. We hope to have some classes or demo's in the spring and early summer.

Linda's Patch met in January to finalize our 2024 project list. In February Carl Abner spoke to us on starting your own gourd plants from seed, and when to start them to maximize the growing season. In March we will make bird feeders. In April we will make flowers from various parts of gourds. In May it will be jewelry made from gourd shards, June will be drums from a gourd of your choosing and in July RoJene Gillentine will be doing a demonstration on Marbleizing. In August Lynn Meier will be demonstrating the art of Doodling. September and October, we sat aside to make Holiday Ornaments. Anyone interested in joining in on one or all of the above is welcome, as always. We meet on the 3rd Sunday of each month from 2-4 pm ET at 1224 W 600 N, Greenfield, IN. One Way To Start Seeds

- 1) Take a half gallon paper milk carton and poke some small drain holes in the bottom of it (DO NOT CUT OFF THE TOP OF THE CARTON), then fill it with 3" to 4" of potting soil.
- 2) After socking your seeds in water overnight, take 2 or 3 of them and plant them no more than ½" deep or as deep as they are long in each of your cartons.
- 3) Keep the potting soil moist (NOT WET) and in a warm place until the seeds sprout and grow till they have 4-6 or more leaves on them.
- 4) After danger of frost has passed transfer the gourd plants carton and all to your garden. Dig a hole large enough to hold your carton and deep ,enough to have the potting soil inside the carton at the same level as the soil outside the carton.
- 5) Carefully cut off the bottom of the carton (DO NOT CUT OFF TOO HIGH UP THE SIDE OF THE CARTON) and place carton and gourd plant in the hole. Move soil in around carton.
- 6) By planting carton and gourd plant together, you place a protective barrier around the plant to protect it from wind, hot sun, and insects.
- 7) For each carton you plant take a 1 gallon plastic carton and cut just the bottom off of it. These can be used to place over the top of your gourd plants in case of late frost, and they will work as a mini greenhouse also.
- 8) After your gourd plants have become well established, you can cut off the carton at ground level and discard it.
