Sugar Creek Gourd Patches (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch will meet at the Thorntown Public Library from 2-4:00 p.m. ET on May 7 and 21. It is time for flowers and butterflies on whole gourds and gourd bowls. Black and white will also be a theme in celebration of Cinco de Mayo, a Mexican holiday, as well as the Indianapolis 500. Karen Niemeyer will display a few b&w gourds and invites others to bring any they may have. On May 21 there also be a red white and blue theme with various patriotic gourds displayed in preparation for Memorial Day and July 4th. Toothbrushes will be on hand for anyone who is not feeling artistic and wants to help clean 60 autumn wing gourds while pondering what they might become. A Patch Project with Pebeo Paints

One of the patch members from The Sugar Creek Patch in Thorntown purchased a set of Pebeo (pronounced Peh-bee-oh or P-bee-oh) Vitrail Glass Paint. A set of 10 45 ml bottles is approximately \$80, so they are not cheap paints. The paint is solvent-based and transparent, for "brilliant stained glass effects on transparent bases."

We wondered how that brilliance would work on gourds. We had two patch workshops where we tried various techniques. We first experimented with natural gourds and found painting a single coat left a very thin paint that didn't have any brilliance, probably because the paint was being absorbed into the gourd. Multiple coats looked better (see the photo on the top right).

We then painted a white undercoat and left it dry completely. The second photo shows some samples of the paint. The right-most swatches, labeled "Yellow" show one coat on top painted on (the small swatch) and a single coat daubed on (the longer stripe). The color is not yellow, but more of a burnt orange. The painted swatch is more yellow, probably because the white is showing through.

The other colors, from right-to-left after the yellow are Blue, Chartreuse, Crimson, and two coats of Crimson. A hair drier was used between coats to get to a tacky paint before applying the second coat.

The colors might be more true-to-name if applied to a glass surface where the light would shine through it instead of being reflected, as the advertising suggests.

The third photo shows a gourd without undercoating. It has metallic silver sticks from a heat gun applied. These still need to be trimmed because it is extremely difficult to get a thin, even line.

The first photo on the left, below, shows (left-to-right) Sandra Townsend, Denise Bechtold, and Lisa Goldman working on projects. The right photo below shows Denise applying a second coat to a gourd. Notice the micro-brushes she is using.

Some final notes. Pebeo does not dry quickly and needs to sit 24-hours to be fully dry. A hair drier causes the paint to become tacky only, and lets the gourd be transported to where it can finish air drying. Once tacky, a second coat can easily be applied if needed. Brush clean-

up is challenging and we found using micro brushes works, and they can simply be discarded. Soaking a brush in mineral spirits then washing with dish soap and water will salvage a brush if needed.

Most importantly, the paint soaks through paper plates, even plastic impregnated paper plates. It even went on through the plastic table covering. We were able to clean the table with scouring powder and a scrubber. A fully plastic plate would be a better choice.
