The show committee decided it was not fair to the competitors to have only one judge for the category competitions. Therefore, category judging did not take place. The other awards were given out. Because of this problem, any exhibitor who had a piece in this year's competition may enter that same piece in a future IGS competition, even though the show books say no repeat entries. We do not feel this show was a true judging of your artistic talent.

# INDIANA GOURD SOCIETY MEMBERSHIP MEETING - October 18, 2025 Draft Minutes

President Denise Bechtold called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. with 21 present.

Secretary Karen Niemeyer presented the minutes of the October 19, 2024, meeting. Phil Moorhead moved they be approved as submitted; Greg Olson seconded; motion carried.

Phil presented the treasurer's report. The bank balance as of the close of business 9-30-25 shows \$6865.87 in the savings (money market) account and \$10,228.81 in the checking account. This is a total of \$17,094.,68. With the \$2500 for Story Awards and \$5000 from Bill Freihofer in escrow, IGS has \$9594.68 in spendable funds. The books balance with the bank statements, and all state and federal tax filings are current. Karen moved and Michelle Fife seconded that the report be filed for audit; motion carried. It was noted that if IGS dissolves, all money in the treasury goes to the American Gourd Society. The AGS is in the process of reorganizing into a parent-child relationship. AGS will become an LLC and Indiana can then incorporate as a member of AGS.

Pat Moore provided the membership report through October 16, 2025, showing 26 members have renewed. There is one new member. She mailed 32 oops cards to 2024 members and has only received 3 back. It was suggested that IGS should go to 4-H, Scouts, and organizations of youth, as well as Master Gardeners. Phil reminded us that last year we agreed by consensus to not partner with the American Heritage Girls Partnership because doing so would cause IGS to loose its non-profit status and our organizational status since that is a religious organization. This is true for any other group with religious affiliation as well.

Discussion followed with a recommendation that we share with people 30 to 50 years old and solicit participation and membership. A chart showed that 90% of people join and drop out after one year. We need to work on retaining these one-year people by making contact with them to be sure they got what they wanted from membership: magazine, patch, programs. We could consider offering classes, even apart from the state show. The board will appoint a committee to recommend changes and bring to the board for review and implementation. Vendors don't want to come to a one-day show.

Ron Bair moved and Greg Olson seconded that any patch which has been inactive for more than a year as of January 1, 2026, be removed from the patch list. Discussion followed. Michelle Fife called the question and the motion passed unanimously.

There was a 15-minute break at 3:15 to clear away the outside gourds since rain was threatening.

There are at present four site options for the 2026 state show. This will be discussed by a committee at a later date.

Phil reported that there was no judging of today's entries because only one of six judges who agreed to come actually showed up. Since volunteers from those present agreed to review the entries, all were judged at the division level rather than at the category level. This means that all exhibits may be re-entered in the same category next year. Award certificates were then given out:

Chairperson's Award - a tie between Jim Bennett and Connie Wegeng

Honey Bear and Mary Miller Award - Michelle Fife

Dried Gourds - Rosemary Phillips

Floral Design - Michelle Fife

Arts & Crafts Basic - a tie between Jack Burger and Michelle Fife

Arts & Crafts Functional - Connie Wegeng

Arts & Crafts Advanced - Michelle Fife

Gallery - Penny Boyce

Children - Isobel Hall

Phil moved and Penny Boyce seconded that Greg Olson be elected to fill the 1st Vice-president's position that Helen Thomas is resigning. The term runs though 2026. Motion carried.

Phil moved and Greg seconded that Ron Bair be elected as Director 1 since Pat Moore has resigned; motion carried. This will be a two-year term.

Phil moved and Karen seconded that Jack Burger be elected as Director 3 when Mac McCrary's term ends in 2025; motion carried. This will be a two-year term.

Pat today resigned as membership chair, effective January 1, 2026. It was agreed that Phil may assume membership responsibilities as well as being treasurer. This will be a one-year term to finish Pat's term.

Michelle moved that Denise, Karen, and Diane Werblo be re-elected by acclimation to their positions as president, secretary, and director 5; Phil seconded; motion carried. These will be two-year terms.

Denise recommends continuing the state show with no admission fee, but charging for classes and vendors. Furthermore, a 2-day show is needed at least or even a set up on Friday for a Saturday-Sunday show. There was discussion whether to continue in October or to move to April or May and include plant and seed sales. Phil moved that a committee be chaired by Greg and include four people to report to the board at its November 15 meeting (11-3:30, Thorntown Public Library); Karen seconded; motion carried. It was agreed that Penny Boyce would co-chair the committee and other members will be Ron Bair, Phil Moorhead, and Pat Moore.

A board meeting and show wrap-up meeting will be held at the Thorntown library on Saturday, November 15, 11-3:30.

There being no further business, Michelle moved and Penny seconded that the meeting adjourn; motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 4:10 p.m.
